### **GINA LONG, MBE** Founder, *GeeWizz*

Eight years ago, she started her own charitable foundation trust, 'GeeWizz', which is a very special, small charity. It supports children and young adults, across Suffolk and Norfolk, who are learning disabled or neurodivergent, have a life-limiting illness or cancer, as well as supporting Sarcoma Cancer research and many capital projects; with financial transparency at the heart of everything the foundation does.

In 2020, Gina created and organised the Ed Sheeran 'Made in Suffolk Legacy Auction', working closely with John and Imogen Sheeran. A total of £506,000 was raised to fund legacy projects – the redevelopment of a much-need playground at the Thomas Wolsey Ormiston Academy in Ipswich, which will be completed this summer 2022 and funding the introduction of a specialist nursing team – including learning disability and palliative care nurses and physiotherapists – at the Zest service, run by St Elizabeth Hospice. Prizes were donated by global superstars from the world of music, sport, art, festival events, hospitality and many organisations.

Away from fundraising, she is a successful entrepreneur, regularly writes columns and articles championing, interviewing and championing successful businesses, individuals, celebrities and entrepreneurs as well as highlighting national and regional charity fundraising achievements and events. She is a 'farmer's wife' and mother to Sam, Ali and five step-children, living on the outskirts of Bury St Edmunds with her husband Andrew.

Stuart Thomason is the CEO of The FSI. They support people leading small charities to build impactful organisations so they too 'get' the needs of small charities who are supporting communities. Stuart has worked in the Third Sector for over 20 years, providing senior leadership support as CEO of Business Launchpad and as programme manager at The Young Foundation and UnLtd (The Foundation for Social Entrepreneurs). He has also founded 2 social enterprises himself and was director at the architecture practice 'studio polpo'.
