Welcome to the Cost of Living: Volunteering information leaflet

This information leaflet has been created by Community Action Suffolk (CAS) in partnership with the Suffolk Volunteering Strategy steering group. It provides an overview of what you may need to consider to help, support, retain and attract volunteers, as well as sources of further information and resources.

Cost of living

The Cost of Living crisis has had a direct impact on volunteers individually, while at the same time there is an increased demand for volunteers. Volunteers are being asked to do more and organisations are facing a shortage of volunteers as volunteering levels are decreasing. The number of hours current volunteers give is also decreasing.


With so many competing priorities for people, is volunteering having to move down the to do list or is it because volunteers cannot risk being out of pocket when volunteering? Are there other factors to consider in a crisis such as this?

How can VCFSE organisations support volunteers?

The cost of living crisis is likely to impact all of us at some point and this leaflet asks us all to consider how we can help, support, retain and attract volunteers and start meaningful conversations about the cost of living for volunteers.

1.Considerations for Volunteer Leaders

Expenses

Ideally, a volunteer should never be out of pocket at any point by volunteering, but highlighting this now is more important than ever:

- Ensure you have a clear, easy-to-follow expenses process
- Make it clear in your volunteer opportunity adverts
- Consider the role of the volunteer and what expenses might be incurred as a result; the expenses for a home-based role will be different from a role which requires travel
- Remind volunteers to claim expenses (as appropriate)
- When planning volunteer involvement include volunteer expenses
- Consider whether you make faster payments to reimburse volunteers if necessary

Involving volunteers does not mean there is no cost to an organisation or volunteer

Health and Wellbeing

Volunteers, like employees may need support with mental health, and financial worries can increase mental health concerns. Are you regularly catching up with volunteers to ask how they are?

- <u>Volunteer Now</u> highlights the Wellness Action Plan as a way to support the mental health of your volunteers
- Know what help and support is available to signpost volunteers to <u>Suffolk Mind</u> <u>Dementia Connect: Alzheimer's Society</u>

Suffolk Good Neighbour Network

- Check in with your volunteers on a regular basis
- The Samaritans are available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year to talk through any issues

Youth and Young People

The impact of the cost of living crisis on younger people cannot be overlooked.

- The <u>Young Minds</u> website provides a useful guide on talking to young people about money worries and the cost of living crisis, including how to offer them reassurance and support
- <u>NSPCC</u> offers advice on supporting children who are struggling with their mental health

Case Study

An East Suffolk Volunteering Pathways Officer helped find a placement for a volunteer, referred from the job centre, at a local museum. Without the opportunity to claim travel expenses for the 6 mile return journey, Billy would unfortunately have been unable to continue to offer her help as she was not in a position to fund the petrol for the trip. The placement is supporting Billy to gain skills and experience for job applications, as well as making the most of her life experience that she can share with the museum. The museum is very happy and have asked Billy to extend her volunteering hours.
